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STEM Development

The Scottish government have set education in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) as a national priority to address a projected skills gap. Here at All Saints we have a core group of teachers from these subjects dedicated to promoting STEM education and leadership skills of our young people.

Learners in S6 are given the opportunity to develop their leadership skills, subject knowledge and soft skills, like communication, teamwork and organisation, in providing learning opportunities for our young people. This session, we are developing a strong partnership with Science Connects, a charity that links STEM professionals with education and voluntary groups, to train our S6 volunteers as Young STEM Ambassadors.

An exciting opportunity came up this session for a group of girls to explore different careers and STEM skills involved in the construction industry at Glasgow Clyde College – Cardonald Campus. There was also a workshop on how the construction industry is preparing for a technological future with 3D printers and Robotic cutting machines. The girls demonstrated high levels of spatial reasoning by assembling a complicated laser-cut box with no instructions.



In another workshop they learned about the maths involved in bricklaying and how engineers use triangles to form strong arches. In their final workshop they learned about plumbing and different joining processes and ended with a bang. (Literally a controlled gas explosion that made everyone jump.)
