Dear Families,

We are delighted to share with you some very special news about an upcoming event at All Saints Roman Catholic High School that will be a significant moment of faith, prayer, and learning for our whole school community.

From Monday 30th March to Thursday 2nd April, All Saints will be honoured to host the Relic of St Carlo Acutis, alongside the internationally renowned Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles, curated by St Carlo himself.

St Carlo Acutis was a young Italian Catholic who died in 2006 at the age of just 15. He is known for his deep love of the Eucharist, which he described as “my highway to heaven”, and for using his gifts with technology to evangelise by creating an exhibition documenting Eucharistic miracles from around the world. He will be canonised in 2025, making this visit especially timely and meaningful.

What will happen during the week?

- During Religious Education lessons, pupils will rotate between:
 - o The Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition (hosted in the Library), and
 - o The Oratory, where there will be opportunities for quiet prayer and Eucharistic Adoration.
- The week will open with a procession led by the Archbishop on Monday 30th March at 10.00am.
- A closing procession will take place on Thursday 2nd April at 12.00pm.
- Throughout the week, students will also take part in daily reflections and prayers as part of a Novena in preparation for Easter.

Invitation to families

We warmly invite families to visit the exhibition on Wednesday 1st April at 4.30pm. This will be a wonderful opportunity to explore the exhibition together

and to share in prayer as a wider school community. Further practical details will be shared closer to the date.

Links with parishes and primary schools

We are pleased that local parishes and nearby primary schools will also be involved, strengthening the links between school, parish, and home, and allowing more young people to encounter the inspiring witness of St Carlo Acutis.
